Current Target Populations & Eligibility

- IDOC-bound
- Non-violent
- High risk (to recidivate)
- High need (often, not always)



Current Issues

Reduction of court admissions → shrinking target population in many counties

Current Issues

Legislation to expand eligibility - SB3388

- **Current eligibility:** Probation-eligible, current non-violent charge, locally-defined target population.
- **Proposed change:** Probation-eligible, locally-defined target population.



SB3388, cont'd

SB3388 would:

- Maintain local control, increase local discretion.
- Result in locally controlled program enrollment decisions based on probation expertise and assessments instead of blanket eligibility restrictions.
- Ensure individuals with the highest risk and needs receive the most appropriate and intensive services and supervision.
- Allow for local programs to serve individuals charged with probation-eligible violent charges such as aggravated assault, domestic battery and resisting an officer.



SB3388, cont'd

SB3388 would NOT:

- Mandate ARI programs to expand eligibility.
- Make any changes to probation eligibility.
- Make any ARI eligibility changes for misdemeanor offenses.
