ICJIA's Research & Analysis Unit

- Core Activities
 - Reports on critical public safety issues and best practices
 - Original research
 - Evaluations of criminal justice programs
 - Technical assistance

ICJIA Grant Making

- ICJIA's grant making has expanded significantly since 2015, going from about \$37 million to more than \$100 million in SFY17
- Grant-making process has also expanded under GATA
 - It takes approximately 6 months to complete a new grant, from designing the Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) to executing funding agreements
